

# XL Series Profibus Communication Module

#### 1 Introduction

The HE-XPBS is used to provide Profibus communications support between a Profibus master and an XL series controller acting as slave.

### 3 Installation Procedure

#### 3.1 Installation Procedure

- a) Disconnect all power from the XLE unit including I/O power.

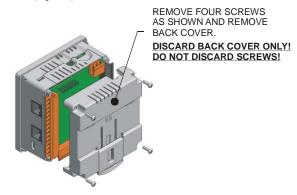


Figure 1 - Removing Back Cover of the XLE

- b) Remove the four screws on the back of the XLe unit and remove the back cover. The back cover can be discarded or saved, but it will be replaced with the extended back cover that ships with the communication add-on. Screws are re-used (Figure 1).

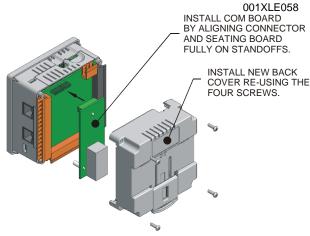


Figure 2 - Installing the Profibus Com Module in the XLE

- Make sure all the jumper settings on the I/O board are set correctly for the application.
- d) Plug the communication board onto the 24-pin connector. Make sure all the pins are properly aligned (Figure 2).
- e) Place the extended back cover onto the unit. It can be helpful to tip it at an angle so the connector on the COM board passes through the opening on the back
- f) Place the screw back into the hole and turn the screw slowly counter clockwise until it clicks into the threads. This prevents the screw from being cross-threaded. Now, turn the screw clock-wise until the cover is firmly secured. Repeat this process for all four (4) screws.

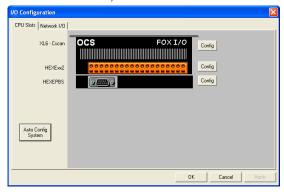
NOTE: If a solid connection cannot be made, then a direct connection to the earth ground screw can be used. Strip and clamp the Profibus cable and then attach an earth ground wire from the clamp to the earth ground screw.

## 4 Cscape Configuration (Profibus Configuration)

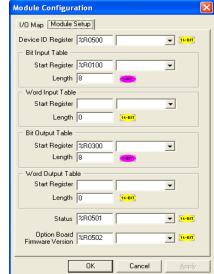
NOTE: Corresponding GSD file (HAPG0C74.GSD) must be loaded in the master device that will communicate with this slave (Refer MAN0919 for configuration details).

Open Cscape and click on the I/O Configuration button window will appear (Profibus option module must be installed as described in the Installation Procedure).



Click on window will appear, select Module Setup. In Module Setup user can configure number of registers to be exchanged, status information and slave id. The number of registers to be exchanged should match with the Master configuration.



 Device ID Register: This field is for configuring Node ID of the Profibus slave,

any word accessible register type can be configured.

Node ID ranges from 1 to 125. If Slave ID is out off range (i.e. less than 1 or greater than 125) Profibus status will be 0xFEFE.

There are 2 methods for setting slave ID:

- Method 1: Slave ID can be set through a logic register. If the ID is changed in the register via ladder, unit needs to be put through RUN-IDLE-RUN mode for this new ID to take effect.
- Method 2: Slave ID can be directly set (value set between range 1 through 125). If the ID is changed then a new configuration needs to be downloaded and unit power cycled for config to take effect.

## b) Bit Input Table:

Start Register: This field is for configuring Input byte data type of Profibus communication, any bit accessible register type can be configured.

Length: In this field user has to define a value in terms of number of bits. Example: For 232-byte data exchange, configure length as 1856 bits = 8 \* 232

## c) Word Input Table:

Start Register: This field is for configuring Input word data type of Profibus communication, any word accessible register type can be configured.

Length: In this field user has to define a value in terms of number of words

# d) Bit Output Table:

Start Register: This field is for configuring Output byte data type of Profibus communication, any bit accessible register type can be configured.

Length: In this field user has to define a value in terms of number of bits. Example: For 1-byte data exchange, configure length as 8 bits.

#### e) Word Output Table:

Start Register: This field is for configuring Output word data type of Profibus communication, any word accessible register type can be configured.

Length: In this field user has to define a value in terms of number of words.

# 3. Status (Read only):

This field is for configuring status word, any word accessible register type of OCS can be configured. Table below describes the status word:

#### Examples:

 a) If Profibus master is configured for 1.50Mbits/s and communicating with profibus slave, the status register will be 0xD3A1.

D = chip release information (refer status information table)

3 = baud rate information

A = slave is in data exchange mode

1 = slave is in passive idle mode

b) If Profibus master is not communicating with slave, status register will be 0xD341

#### Firmware version:

This field is for configuring Profibus option module firmware version number, any word accessible register type of OCS can be configured for this.

Example: If the selected register is %R1 and the firmware version is 0.02, then 0.02\*100 = 2 will be displayed.

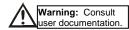
NOTE: Power cycle of the device is needed for every new configuration download to slave device for this configuration to be active.

# 5 Installation / safety

When found on the product, the following symbols specify
